We know that a lot of people are concerned about those they see sleeping rough and want to help. That is why we have offered to raise awareness of the Liverpool Cathedral Sleepout.

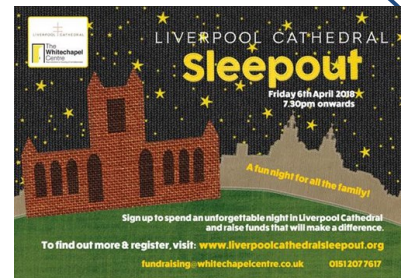
The Cathedral Sleepout is a family fundraising event taking place on 6th April in the beautiful Liverpool Anglican Cathedral and is open to all ages.

PLEA FROM HOCKEY CLUB



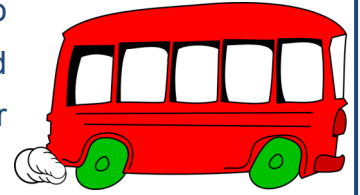
Formby hockey club, which is attended by many of our children, is raising money to improve the

The second project is in Concepcion in Paraguay, where they are building a hostel/community centre for people (who live a long way away in the Chaco), to stay in whilst their loved ones are receiving hospital treatment. To raise funds we are asking children to bring in any spare change from home between now and Easter; we are also raffling two big soft bunnies with chocolates created by Mrs Woodward.
