

NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. Programme

Pupils from Y1 to Y6 will be participating in the **NSPCC's** *Speak out. Stay safe.* **Programme** this half term. *Speak out. Stay safe.* is a programme for children aged 5-11, which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age- appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom-based activities which we have reviewed. We will all remember Glynn's cycle-race-with-a-difference from a previous newsletter. He has sent us this update:

I am delighted to let you know that I had a successful Great Race! I really surprised myself by finishing 17th out of 44 solo riders in the three hours of non-stop racing. My tortoise and hare tactic of just-keep-pedalling meant that I even did more laps than half of the team entries!

My total distance was 55 laps / 31 miles (for context, the winner did 77 laps).

More importantly, a fantastic £1780 has been raised so far in Charlotte's memory for SUDC and the Lullaby Trust. That really motivated me to dig deep.

I must also thank everyone who helped this happen, be it time freed up to practise, help with the pit stops, post-race pizza or encouraging comments along the way - we rarely succeed without the support of others.

PARENT GOVERNOR VACANCY

DT PROJECTS PAYMENT REQUEST

The cost to school for equipment for Design Technology projects has massively increased. The major cost is for parts such as motors and batteries, or materials including wood and wood glue. We have a vibrant DT curriculum and do not want to ask children to dismantle their finished projects so



that we can re-use the expensive parts, as they will have worked hard to complete them and will be very proud of their work. We are therefore asking for an annual donation of **£10 per pupil** to contribute to these costs. Payments can be made on the Spider app. If your child is eligible for pupil premium, we will take the payment from the additional funding school receives, so there is no need to pay. If any other family is finding it difficult to make the payment, please speak to Mrs Dwan, our Parent Support Adviser, in strictest confidence. Please note Reception parents and carers already make a "snack" contribution and their design-and-make activities do not have the same cost implications, so these payments are for Y1-Y6 only.
